Our hymns are found in the **Worship and Rejoice Hymnal** (WRH) and the Scripture Texts are in the **Pew Bible**. If you are new to the Anglican way of worship, you will find assistance in the "Worship Overview and Preparation" handout in the narthex or under "Anglican Helps for Worship" on our website. SERMON NOTES

The message is focused on Mary's Song in Luke 1:46-55. In St. Luke's infancy narrative in chaps 1-2, we read of the conception and birth of John, the conception and birth of Jesus Christ, Jesus being circumcised, Jesus being offered at the temple on the 40th day (where Mary and Joseph will come for the purification having given birth to a son), and Jesus at age 12 in the temple about his father's business. Also, in Luke 1-2, we have passages taken and used in the church's hymnology; they become part of the liturgical singing and worship of the Christian people. There are five of them: Ave Maria (1:28, 42), Gloria (2:14), Magnificat (1:46-55), Benedictus (1:68-79), and the Nunc Dimittis (2:29-32). What is the message of the Magnificat?

- 1. Proclaim the Lord's Presence in Your Life (1:46)
- 2. Cultivate Humility; Resist Temptations to be Prideful (1:48, 51-52))
- 3. Serve Others on Behalf of God (1:54)

When you pray and live out Mary's Song, magnify the Lord in your life. Seek mercy, not pride or strength or might. Seek to be God's servant. Now, go make disciples!

Reflection: What part of the message do I most need to integrate into my relationship with Christ and His Church? How can my participation through the ministries of Christ Anglican assist me in my obedience to the Lord's calling upon life?

Prayer: Dear Lord, teach me to proclaim your presence in my life and to serve others with humility and love. Help me to see the God-given value in every person I meet. May my actions reflect Your love and compassion. Amen. THE NICENE CREED


